Event 1

Inauguration of Anti-Ragging Week Celebration

Anti-Ragging Week Celebration at AVIT was inaugurated on 12th August 2025 in the Indoor Auditorium, marking the start of a week-long awareness campaign from 12th to 18th August 2025. The program began at 11:00 AM with the Tamil Thaai Vaazhthu, creating a respectful and solemn atmosphere. Dr. J. Janet, Principal of AVIT, delivered the Presidential Address, warmly greeting the gathering and stressing the importance of maintaining a ragging-free campus. This was followed by the Felecitation Address from Dr. L. On August 13, 2025, a workshop titled "Psychological Impact of Ragging and the Role of Positive Peer Support in Prevention" was held at AVIT in TBL 106, coordinated by Dr. Partiban from Civil Engineering and Ms. P. Poornima from EEE. The session, scheduled at 11:00 am, featured Ms. Saranya Ganesan (Ph.D), Psychologist and student counsellor, VMCC as the resource person. Ms. Saranya guided participants through the emotional and psychological effects that ragging can have on students, highlighting symptoms like anxiety, depression, and trauma, and the long-term repercussions such experiences can inflict. She emphasized how positive peer support is a critical factor in prevention, explaining that a culture of empathy, active listening, and student solidarity significantly reduces the risk of ragging incidents. The interactive workshop included practical strategies that students can employ to foster a supportive environment, illustrated by real-life examples and open discussions. By enabling students to recognize warning signs and encouraging peer intervention, the session empowered attendees to become proactive agents of change within their academic community. The event was well received, with participants appreciating the opportunity to gain insights from Ms. Saranya's expertise as a practicing psychologist.

Flash Mob on awareness on Anti-Ragging





On August 13, 2025, 12.00 pm, a vibrant flash mob event on anti-ragging awareness was organized in front of the Food Court, AVIT in coordination with ACCL and the Fine Arts Club as part of the

institution's Anti-Ragging Week activities. Students from various disciplines came together for an energetic performance, utilizing dance and creative movement to convey the serious psychological and physical harms caused by ragging. The flash mob aimed to foster a culture of safety and respect by visually depicting acts of peer solidarity, empathy, and positive intervention, while powerfully encouraging students to speak out and support each other. Faculty and members of ACCL and the Fine Arts Club played an active role in conceptualizing the event, ensuring that it aligned with campus values of inclusivity and zero tolerance towards any form of ragging. The enthusiastic response from both the performers and audience, alongside the widespread sharing of flash mob content on social media platforms, amplified its message and reinforced AVIT's collective commitment to a ragging-free campus.

Event 7

Telecast of Short Films on Anti Ragging from UGC websites

From August 12 to 18, 2025, as part of the Anti-Ragging Week observance mandated by the University Grants Commission (UGC), AVIT telecast a series of anti-ragging short films to students, sourced directly from the UGC's official collection. These films, available on the UGC's anti-ragging website, are designed to educate viewers about the detrimental psychological and physical effects of ragging and reinforce the importance of fostering a safe and supportive campus environment. The short films served as powerful visual tools to raise awareness, stimulate empathy among students, and encourage positive peer interventions. Alongside these telecasts, UGC guidelines encouraged institutions to engage their communities through various creative activities such as workshops, social media campaigns, and competitions. AVIT complied with these directives by screening the films online, reaching students and faculty across departments, and integrating these in broader anti-ragging programs during the week. The initiative not only helped in sensitizing the campus community but also aligned AVIT with UGC's national effort to create ragging-free educational spaces across India.
