





Most Inspiring Women – Mother Teresa – Servant Leader

On August 26 1910, Mother Teresa was born in Skopje, Macedonia, and came to India at the age of 18 after becoming a nun. She decided to live the rest of her life as a nun. Mother Teresa is known to the entire world for the kind of humane person she was and for her selfless attitude towards needy and helpless people.

Mother Teresa was the founder of the Order of the Missionaries of Charity, a Roman Catholic congregation of women dedicated to helping the poor. Mother Teresa and her helpers built homes for orphans, nursing homes for lepers and hospices for the terminally ill in Calcutta. Mother Teresa's organization also engaged in aid work in other parts of the world. Considered one of the 20th Century's greatest humanitarians, she was canonized as "Saint Teresa of Calcutta" in 2016

Mother Teresa was caring, especially for the poor, sick and need. She was respectful, treating everyone she encountered with dignity. The two important qualities of Mother Teresa were to respect the people of the earth and to care each other in the society. She is the most famous and hardworking lady. One of Mother Teresa's great strengths was her relentless focus on the core mission of her organization – "Helping the poorest of the poor".

For Mother Teresa, God was always simply reaching out, not just in our failings. And she did not see herself as "doing great things." Indeed, one of her favorite sayings was "There are no great things, only small things with great love" And there's where one will find happiness. "Mother Teresa is a wonderful example of a servant leader," says Franz. "She never set out to be famous, yet her humbleness and faithfulness were so profound that people couldn't stop talking about them."

Mother Teresa has been awarded more than 120 different accolades and awards, some during her lifetime and others after. The Padma Shri in 1962, The Ramon Magsaysay Peace Prize in 1962, the Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding in 1069, the Pope John XXIII Peace Prize in 1971, the Pacem in Terris Award in 1976 and in 1979, the Nobel Peace Prize "for work undertaken in the struggle to overcome poverty and distress, which also constitutes a threat to peace". Mother Teresa was a unique individual that stood out of the crowd because of her involvement in helping the sick, poor and dying. Like Mother Teresa we all should strive to be Charitable, Unselfish and Courageous.




